Investigator Insight: With the weather continuing to be so COLD ☹ Here are some great driving tips:

- Regular maintenance of your vehicle will reduce the chance of breaking down. Check your tire pressure regularly and tire tread should be at least 1/8-inch.
- Pack a winter travel safety kit. Recommended bare minimum items include a cell phone, flashlight and extra batteries, blankets, tow rope, ice scraper, matches, cat litter (tire traction), can of De-Icer, food, and drinking water.
- Turn on your headlights, and keep your lights and windows clean to increase visibility.
- Slowdown in poor weather conditions. Better to get to your destination late than not at all.
- Be extra careful crossing over bridges and overpasses since they freeze first.
- Do not pass plows and sanding trucks to avoid an accident or worse roadway conditions ahead of the truck.
- Allow room between you and the vehicle in front of your vehicle. Brake gently to avoid losing control of your vehicle.
- Stay in your vehicle and wait for assistance if you get stuck. Run your vehicle and the heater in short intervals and crack the window to avoid
